Subj: DESIGNATION OF SALUTING SHIPS AND STATIONS

Ref: (a) Navy Regulations 1990, Art. 1212

Encl: (1) List of ship-types designated as saluting ships
(2) List of designated saluting stations

1. Purpose. To promulgate lists of ships and stations designated to fire gun salutes.

2. Cancellation. OPNAVINST 5060.5D.

3. Background. Reference (a) defines saluting ships and stations as those so designated by the Secretary of the Navy or his duly authorized representative. The Secretary of the Navy designates those stations authorized to return national gun salutes fired by foreign warships. The Chief of Naval Operations is the duly authorized representative of the Secretary of the Navy to designate all other saluting ships and stations.


4. Action

a. Enclosure (1) lists ship-types designated as saluting ships.

b. Some ship-types that possess a saluting capability may be directed by Combatant Commanders and Fleet Commanders to fire or return gun salutes when required in the national interest.
