JACKSONVILLE, FL AND UNMANNED PATROL SQUADRON ONE NINE  
DETACHMENT MUGU, POINT MUGU, CA

1. Purpose. To approve the establishment of Unmanned Patrol Squadron One Nine (VUPRON ONE NINE) and Unmanned Patrol Squadron One Nine Detachment Mugu (VUPRON ONE NINE DET MUGU), per reference (a).

2. Background. This action establishes the first of two MQ-4C Triton Unmanned Aerial Surveillance (UAS) squadrons to support combatant commanders requirements for operational and exercise broad area maritime surveillance services.

3. Organizational Changes. Effective 1 October 2013, establish VUPRON ONE NINE and VUPRON ONE NINE DET MUGU. The following applies:

b. Mission. To operate continuously from fixed land bases supporting operational and exercise requirements of combatant commanders, to operate and maintain the MQ-4C Triton UAS to initially support 5th Fleet, 6th Fleet, 7th Fleet, U.S. Fleet Forces Atlantic Operations and Commander Task Force 20 operations, and to be prepared to support Northern Command and Southern Command operations when tasked.

4. Action
